The Brightline rail service, operating since 2018 in the Sunshine State, transforms the journey between Central and South Florida into an enjoyable experience in

The Brightline Orlando station opened in late 2023, making it easy for Orlando visitors to explore two major Florida regions - minus the stress and logistics of driving. The rail service bills itself as high-speed travel, which may be true by typical U.S. standards but would disappoint visitors from Europe or Japan. Nevertheless, the trafficless experience away from car-clogged I-95 rates as comparatively fast. Spacious seating with ample legroom ensures a comfortable ride, and large windows allow you to soak in the ever-changing panorama whizzing by. Onboard amenities such as complimentary Wi-Fi, access to streaming services and a beverage-and-snack service keep you entertained and refreshed throughout the trip.

Traveling at speeds up to 125 mph, the train whisks you to West Palm Beach in just two hours and Miami in about three hours, with stops in between at Boca Raton, Fort Lauderdale and Aventura. Whether planning a day trip, long weekend or full week, this high-speed train connects you seamlessly to a broad range of experiences.


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you want to see the real Orlando area, explore beyond the theme park gates.

Visit the **Orlando Science Center** to stargaze, explore hands-on exhibits and enjoy a larger-than-life film on an 8,000-square-foot screen. Swim

with the dolphins at **Discovery Cove** for an interactive, memorymaking experience. Stop by **Boxi Park**, a unique outdoor space built from repurposed shipping containers, boasting an outdoor food hall ambiance, live entertainment and special events. Experience the cozy jazz lounge vibe at Judson's Live, a new cabaret-style music venue at the **Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing** Arts with just 150 seats, serving sophisticated light bites and cocktails. Dine at Michelin-designated restaurants, including Kaya (earning the Green Star, a sustainability rating), Otto's High Dive (a nod to its exceptional cocktails), and BACÁN (with fabulous bold flavors of the Americas). Explore the trendy Mills 50 District, where you can savor the explosion of Asian flavors

at Vietnamese pho houses,

Korean BBQ joints and ramen shops. Orlando's tony Winter Park suburb beckons you for quiet exploration. Book the Winter Park Scenic Boat Tour through the Chain of Lakes, with a local guide narrating the area's history as the boat glides across lakes and winds its way through canals draped with Spanish moss. City eatery. Soak in the local culture at CityPlace aka Rosemary Square and historic Clematis Street, lined with local shops, restaurants and museums and boasting picturesque waterfront views.

Head to Boca Raton, where art enthusiasts will find a treasure trove in Mizner Park. Explore the fascinating exhibits at the Boca Raton Museum of Art, then lose yourself amid the upscale boutiques that dot this cultural hub.

Nature lovers will find serenity at Morikami
Museum and Japanese
Gardens, about halfway between West Palm Beach and Boca Raton in Delray Beach. Stroll along peaceful paths, visit the bonsai collection and unwind in the traditional Japanese tea house. Afterward, indulge in superb Vietnamese cuisine at Le Colonial, a stylish hotspot offering a delicious array of shareable

dishes amid old-world French glamour. In Fort Lauderdale, mix your love of art and nature at the whimsical **Bonnet House Museum & Gardens**, a 1920s mansion with stunning tropical flora and an impressive orchid collection.
